Eric Taberlay, a Breton, was probably one of the leading yachtsmen of his time. He was born in 1931 in Nantes and was drowned off Pembrokeshire June 14, 1998. He was a former French naval officer and was considered the father of French yachting who won several races, Transatlantic and Round the world, setting record times in boats all called 'Pen Duick'.
