When there was a successful catch, the women on the shore would bake the 'heavy' cake. It was their job to take their men 'a jug of tea' and some cake, once the men pulled the net and fish ashore. The cake was made of plain flour, lard, sugar and dried fruit with the dough rolled out in sheets like pastry, marked in a criss-cross pattern and baked in the 'slab'. Blanche Brown remembered her mother taking the tea and 'heavy' cake to Sandy Cove (Keel Alley) when the seine nets full of fish were pulled up there.
