The Nativity play "Bethlehem" was written and produced by Father Bernard Walke. Radio producer Filson Young persuaded Father Walke to put out an appeal for the childrens home that he had started in the East End of London. This was the first broadcast appeal of its kind, a practise which continues today. In 2013, programme producer, Ted Gundry, gathered together some of the original cast to describe what it was like to be at the centre of this unique occasion and to hear again their voices, when as young children, they performed "Bethlehem".

The choir are believed to be the only male choir, certainly in Cornwall, to have published its own history. "Buccas Song" covers the first seventy years in the life of the Choir. They built up a unique centre, overlooking Mount's Bay, that is now administered by a Trust they set up. During the "Torrey Canyon" crisis of 1967 thousands of oiled birds were treated here and their work gained worldwide renown. Just one man survived (William Freeman) after the lifeboat was launched in horrendous weather conditions and winds of more than 100mph. The John and Sarah Eliza Stych was on loan from Padstow, as the St Ives station had lost its previous boat the year before when it responded to a cruiser Alba that was wrecked off the town. The day after the tragedy, the remains of the SS Wilton was found wrecked on nearby rocks with no survivors from a crew of 30. Locals retaliated by seizing non-Cornish vessels and throwing their catch overboard. This led to three days of rioting, quelled only by the intervention of a naval destroyer.
